**“The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.’ And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit...Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.’”**



**Sunday of Divine Mercy  
April 11, 2021**

**Praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet**  
(using ordinary Rosary Beads)

1. Make the *Sign of the Cross*.
2. Repeat three times: O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!
3. Pray an *Our Father*.
4. Pray a *Hail Mary*.
5. Pray the *Apostles’ Creed*.
6. On the *Our Father* beads, pray: **Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.**
7. On the *Hail Mary* beads, pray: **For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.**
8. Repeat for the five decades.
9. Repeat three times: **Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.**

In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her diary. St. Faustina’s diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

### The Sisters of Saint Joseph of Philadelphia Invite You to Celebrate Laudato Si' Year

Pope Francis designated May 24, 2020 through May 24, 2021 as Laudato Si' Year to commemorate the fifth anniversary of his landmark encyclical on the care for our common home. The following is an excerpt from Laudato Si' and a reflection provided by the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Philadelphia.



**Pope Francis's *Laudato Si'* #211:** Only by cultivating sound virtues will people be able to make a selfless ecological commitment. Education in environmental responsibility can encourage ways of acting which directly and significantly affect the world around us, such as avoiding the use of plastic and paper, reducing water consumption, separating refuse, cooking only what can reasonably be consumed, showing care for other living beings, using public transport or car-pooling, planting trees, turning off unnecessary lights, or any number of other practices. All of these reflect a generous and worthy creativity which brings out the best in human beings. Reusing something instead of immediately discarding it, when done for the right reasons, can be an act of love which expresses our own dignity.

**Reflection:** What habits have you adopted in recent years to minimize waste? What new practice could you adopt? Consider that all these practices are acts of love.


Several months after Fox's death I had an amazing dream. I was walking in a beautiful sunlit meadow and heard someone calling my name. In the distance, I saw Fox waving to me from his wheelchair. He had a blanket over his lap.

As I got closer, I heard him shouting, “Lex, Lex, come here. I got something I want to show you!” As I approached, Fox pulled the blanket off his lap, stood up and danced around with joy. He had two legs and he was whole. I woke up with the most wonderful, peaceful, joyful feeling I have ever experienced.

I believe Fox really came to me in that dream to thank me and to give me a gift. It was the gift of showing me how much he was loved by God; and the knowledge that despite the circumstances of his death, God had healed Fox and welcomed him home. And maybe it was the Holy Spirit's way of telling me, through Fox, that everything I had believed is really true – that we are all destined to be saints, without exception.

Be at peace if there is a loved one in your life who left this world under tragic or untimely circumstances. For even in our darkest moment of brokenness, our loving God heals us and makes us whole. Just like he did for my friend Fox.



### OFFICE OF CONCERN FOOD PANTRY at St. Cecilia Church, Englewood
