TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGESunday, October 29th

Matthew 22:34-40

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law, tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

Reflection

"One of the greatest gifts we can give someone is time. To show our love for God and for our neighbor, giving the gift of time is the best way to start. We give God our time when we pray. We give our neighbor our time when we go out of our way to do something for them. This is the love Jesus calls us to in today's Gospel."

All Saints Day – This feast, honoring all the saints of the Church, known and unknown, provides an opportunity to reflect on the nature of sainthood and celebrate the exemplary faithfulness of holy men and women of every place and time, whose lives and deeds inspire us.

Thursday Wisdom 3:1-9; Romans 5:5-11; John 6:37-40

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day) – Since the early Church, Christians have prayed for the dead, and in 988, Odilo, abbot of the French monastery of Cluny, established the tradition of keeping, 'with joyous affection, the memory of all the faithful departed who have lived from the beginning of the world until the end.' By the fourteenth century, the commemoration had spread and was universally accepted in the Latin Church.

Friday Romans 9:1-5; Luke 14:1-6**Saturday** Romans 11:1-2a, 11-12, 25-29; Luke 14:1, 7-11

Saint Charles Borromeo, Bishop (Memorial) – As archbishop, he was one of the leading figures in the Catholic reformation of the Church after the Council of Trent. May we learn from him that 'if we wish to make any progress in the service of God, we must begin every day of our life with new eagerness.'

“We Are All Called To Be Saints”

On November 1st the Church will celebrate the Feast of All Saints. This is *our* day because we are all called to be saints. But what is a saint? For openers, they were real live human beings like you and me. They had hopes and dreams, fears and self-doubts, good days and bad days. Even the saints made mistakes. At times they may have been selfish, rude and petty. They were people with all the imperfections, troubles, and quirks that we experience. They would understand and empathize with our struggles because they themselves faced them.

It would help us grow spiritually if we take the saints down from the pedestals we've put them on, and bring them into our everyday lives. That way they become touchable to us. We can look at them and say, “I want to be like he or she was. They did it, so I know that I can do it too!”

I have always found Saint Peter to be most encouraging. He was a man after my own heart. He was emotional, impulsive and often indecisive. He shouted his undying loyalty to Jesus barely twelve hours before he pretended he never knew him. But Peter, unlike Judas, kept scraping himself up off the floor each time that he failed. Though he felt deep shame and remorse, he still recommitted himself anew to Jesus. However, his human nature kept getting in his way. After being forgiven over and over again, and given the responsibility of being the rock of Jesus' church, Peter still made mistakes.

As legend has it, Peter was making a quick getaway from Rome while Nero was executing his conscience—in the form of Jesus—on the Appian

Way. Jesus asked him a question, “Quo Vadis? Where are you going, Peter?” And Peter, remorseful, once more recommitted himself. He turned around, returned to Rome and to martyrdom.

Saint Peter was one of Jesus' very best friends; and today, twenty centuries later, he is one of our greatest saints. But he was far from perfect—right up to the end.

God is calling you and me to be saints. But what is a Saint?

The word ‘saint’ comes from the Latin word ‘sanctus’ which means ‘holy’. And ‘holy’ with an *h* really means ‘wholly’ with a *wh*. God wants us to be *whole*, to eventually get it all together. But God wants us to realize that this will probably never happen during our lifetime on earth; that we, like the greatest of saints, are human and will continue to have good days and bad days. Instead, God asks us to commit ourselves to the process of BECOMING whole: to live our lives with a fundamental option for goodness, compassion, forgiveness, and unconditional love; to keep renewing and recommitting ourselves to that option each time we fall. God asks us to look at the saints and to say, “I can do it too!”

God is calling us *all* to be saints.

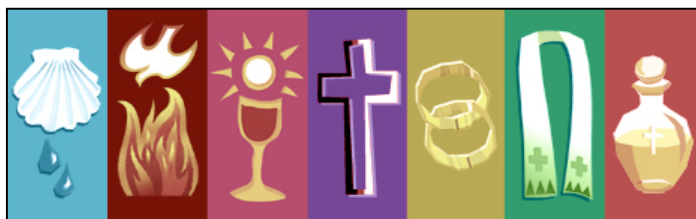

For over 40 years, the volunteers at the **Office of Concern Food Pantry** have been assisting families in Bergen County with weekly supplemental food.

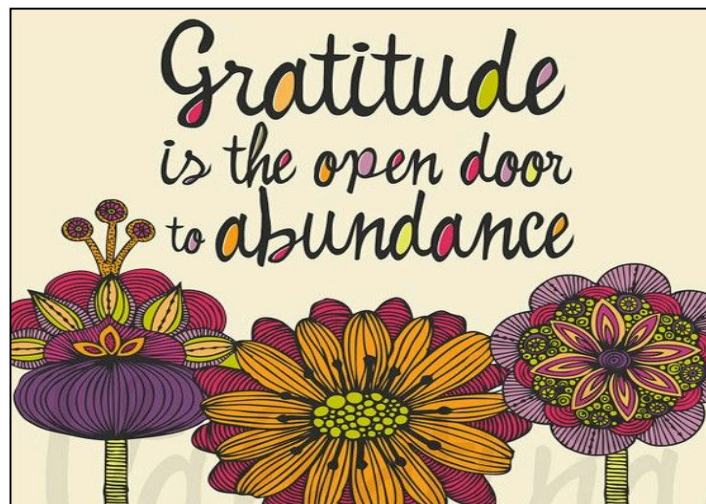
