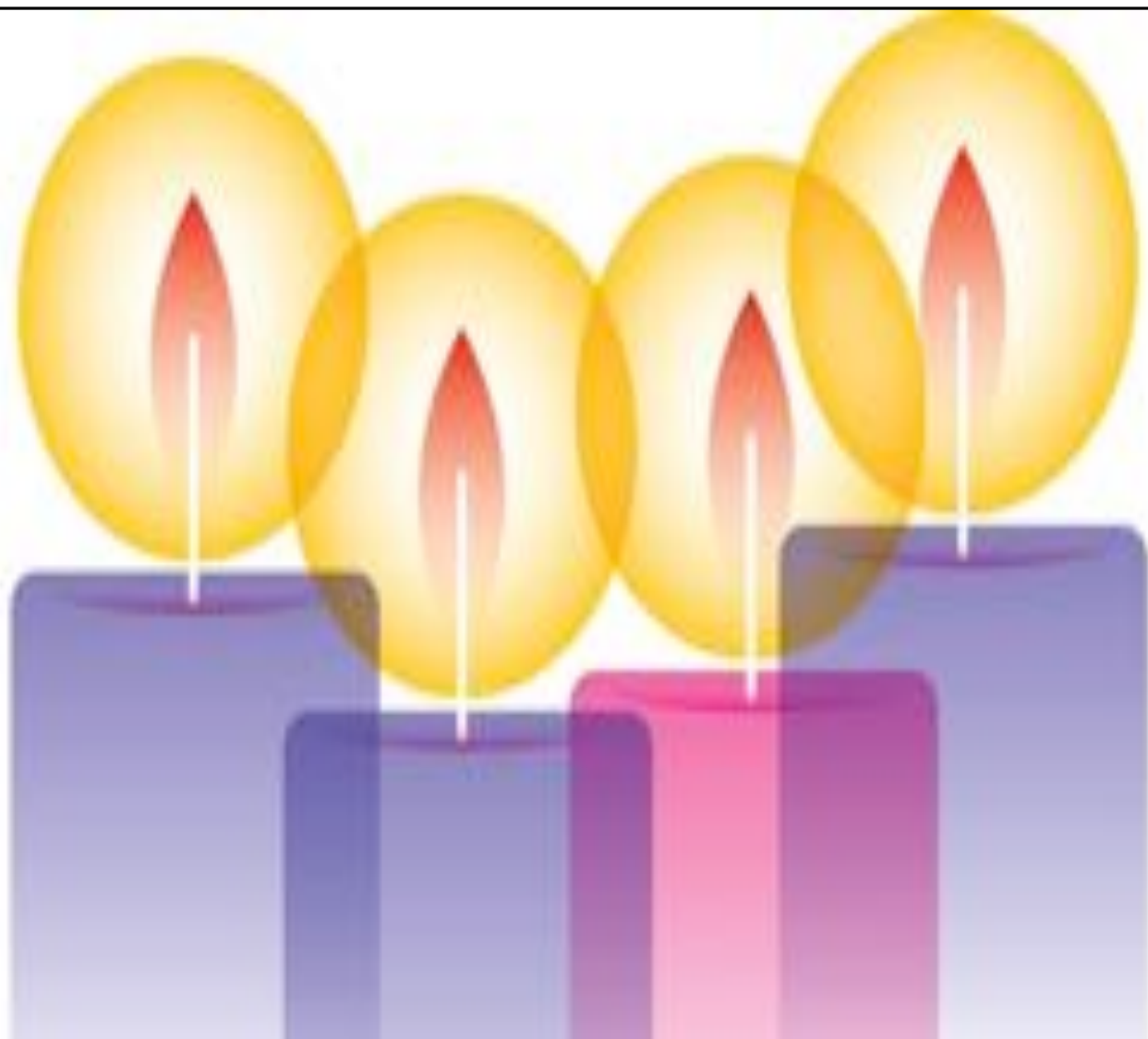

TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGESunday, December 24th

Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you". . . Then the angel said to her. . . "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." . . . Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

Saint Stephen, The First Martyr (Feast) – Stephen is the first-named among the seven deacons chosen by the twelve apostles to minister to Greek-speaking Christians in Jerusalem. He is the first recorded martyr of the New Testament and patron saint of deacons.

Saint John, Apostle and Evangelist (Feast) – Like Peter, John and his brother James (the sons of Zebedee) were called from their fishing business to follow Jesus. John has been traditionally identified as the author of the fourth gospel, the Book of Revelation, the three letters that bear his name, and as the "Beloved Disciple."

The Holy Innocents, Martyrs (Feast) – Today's feast commemorates the male children slain instead of Jesus by King Herod in his desire to eliminate the newborn king.

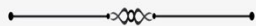

“The wait is over. This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The Catholic Church has designated the four weeks preceding Christmas as Advent, a time to prepare the way of the Lord for His coming as our King and Savior.

By participating in various time-honored traditions, such as making Jesse trees or putting on a Christmas play at home, Catholic families can engage more fruitfully in the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

The Church primarily celebrates Christmas from Christmas Day until the Solemnity of the Epiphany, which commemorates the manifestation of Christ as the Savior of the whole world (cf. Mt. 2:1-12). The Church has also traditionally celebrated Christmas for 40 days, culminating on the Feast of the Presentation (Feb. 2). During this time, the birth of Christ is celebrated as one continuous festival. It is just as important to celebrate during the Christmas season as it is to prepare for Christ during Advent.”

We're reading . . .

The Fisherman's Tomb: The True Story of the Vatican's Secret Search by John O'Neill

In 1939, a team of workers beneath the Vatican unearthed an early Christian grave. This surprising discovery launched a secret quest that would last decades—a quest to discover the long-lost burial place of the Apostle Peter. From earliest times, Christian tradition held that Peter—a lowly fisherman from Galilee, whom Christ made leader of his Church—was executed in Rome by Emperor Nero and buried on Vatican Hill. But his tomb had been lost to history. Now, funded anonymously by a wealthy American, a small army of workers embarked on the dig of a lifetime.

Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals his love, a love which precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives. Transformed by this love, we gain fresh vision, new eyes to see; we realize that it contains a great promise of fulfillment, and that a vision of the future opens up before us. Faith, received from God as a supernatural gift, becomes a light for our way, guiding our journey through time.”

“The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ’s second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord’s birth on Christmas.

The Christmas Manger . . .

From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus’ promise to come back. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Luke 21:34-36). The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, we focus on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223. The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time. When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.”

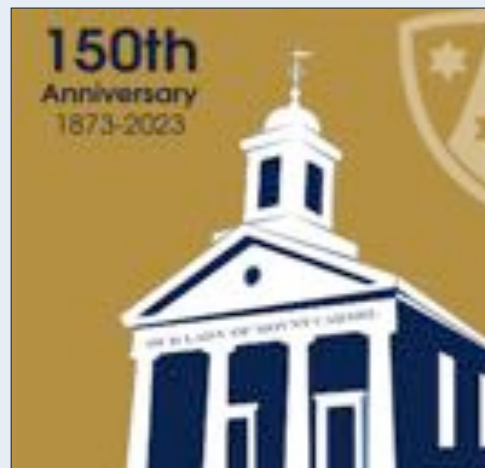

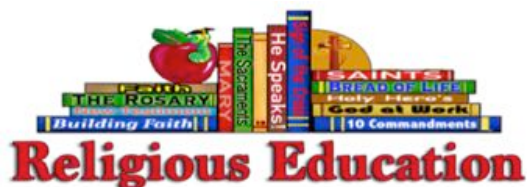

Symbolism of the Advent Wreath

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The wreath of evergreens depicts the immortality of our soul and the new, everlasting life promised to us through Christ. The circle of the wreath symbolizes the eternity of God's love for us. A tradition is that each of the four candles represents one thousand years, a total of four thousand years from Adam and Eve until Christ's birth.



Family Advent Activity

Today's candle is the candle of LOVE. It represents the love that was sent from God through His son, Jesus Christ. On this Fourth Sunday of Advent we can ask God to increase within us a desire to do His will. Some things may be difficult or confusing, but Jesus opens doors for us that seem difficult to open. As a family, pray about ways to overcome things that may be difficult for you. Light the fourth Advent candle and consider ways you can bring peace and love to others.
