


TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE

Sunday, December 31st Luke 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] took [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord . . . Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon . . . It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord . . . and when the parents brought in the child Jesus . . . he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: 'Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace' . . . There was also a prophetess, Anna . . . she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

Reflection

"Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple to present him to the Lord because he was their firstborn son. Before he can even be consecrated, however, Simeon and Anna recognize the Savior of the world in this babe. In faith, they have waited all their lives for this moment to come. Their fidelity and devotion to God brought them to the temple each day and allowed them to see the light of the world who would shine forth for all to see."

Saints Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen. Bishops and Doctors of the Church (Memorial) – Born in Asia Minor, these men are two of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church...because of their preaching, teaching, and defense of the faith against the Arians.

Thursday 1 John 3:7-10; John 1:35-42

<u>Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Religious (Memorial)</u> – Born in New York, Elizabeth Bayley married and had five children. After her husband died, she became a Catholic and founded a girls' school in Baltimore. She founded the Sisters of Charity, the first community of active women religious begun in America, adopting a modified rule of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. Friday 1 John 3:11-21; John 1:43-51

<u>Saint John Neumann. Bishop (Memorial)</u> – Born in Bohemia, John Neumann emigrated as a missionary to America. He was consecrated bishop of Philadelphia. Devoted to spreading God's word by preaching and building churches, he was a strong advocate of Catholic education.



The Gift of Diversity in the Church

Let us pray that the Holy Spirit helps us recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community, and to discuss the richness of different ritual traditions in the heart of the Catholic Church.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY JANUARY 1

"The feast is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. The title "Mother of God" is a western derivation from the Greek Theotokos, which means "God-bearer". On this day, we are reminded of the role that the Blessed Virgin played in the plan of our salvation. Through the Holy Spirit, God the Father prepared Mary to be the dwelling place where His and His Spirit could dwell among men. Christ's birth was made possible by Mary's fiat, or sanctioning of God's plan with her words, "Be it done to me according to thy word". Calling Mary "Mother of God" is the highest honor we can give to her. Just as Christmas honors Jesus as the "Prince of Peace", the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God honors Mary as the "Queen of Peace". New Year's Day is also designated as the "World Day of Peace", further acknowledging the role of Mary in our hearts and in our world."

The Virgin Mary teaches us what it means to live in the Holy Spirit and what it means to accept the news of God in our lives. The Fisherman's Tomb: The True Story of the Vatican's Secret Search by John O'Neill

In 1939, a team of workers beneath the Vatican unearthed an early Christian grave. This surprising discovery launched a secret quest that would last decades—a quest to discover the long-lost burial place of the Apostle Peter. From earliest times, Christian tradition held that Peter—a lowly fisherman from Galilee, whom Christ made leader of his Church—was executed in Rome by Emperor Nero and buried on Vatican Hill. But his tomb had been lost to history. Now, funded anonymously by a wealthy American, a small army of workers embarked on the dig of a lifetime.


FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Friday, January 5th

"One of Us"

One of my favorite Christmas songs isn't really a Christmas holiday song at all. It's a song called, "One of Us." Composed in 1995 by Eric Bazilian and recorded by Joan Osborne, it was the theme song of the Emmy-nominated 2003 TV series, "Joan of Arcadia." The show is about a teenage girl named Joan who is visited by God disguised as everyday people. She is given assignments by God that eventually bring healing and grace into the lives of others.

The lyrics of the song pose a question:

What if God was one of us? Just a slob like one of us. Just a stranger on the bus, Trying to make his way home.²

I see this as a Christmas song because it reminds me of the Incarnation of God into our world as Jesus Christ, and that God is traveling alongside each of us as we journey through life.

God so loved the world that he came to live among us. He chose to ride the bus of life with us; to live, love, laugh, weep, suffer and die with us. God entered our time and space just to show us the way to get home.

That way is 'love.' Jesus didn't come to put burdens on our backs, or to appease an angry God. He didn't come to give us a bunch of new rules and regulations. He came to teach us how to truly love and forgive.

When Jesus was asked what we had to do to have eternal life, he gave a simple answer: "Love God with your whole heart and soul, and love others—all others—the same way." That's what the Incarnation is all about. That's what Christmas is all about. It's not really about giving and getting presents. It's about love and forgiveness.


When you and I were conceived, God put a little piece of Godself into each of us. That little piece of God is our immortal soul, it is our true self, it is the presence of Christ within us. And life is the journey of our soul back home to God. It is our bus ride to eternal life. But we don't make that journey alone. God is always riding the bus with us. All that God asks in return is that we love and forgive each other as God loves and forgives us.


As we move through this final week of Advent, let's ask ourselves how well we are doing with that. Are we kind and forgiving, or do we carry a grudge? Are we inclusive, non-judgmental, and accepting, or do we exclude others who do not measure up to our moral or political standards? Are the doors to our heart always open, or are there family members and friends whom we have shut out of our lives?

As each of us prepares to celebrate Christmas, the Incarnation of God into our world, let us reopen any doors to our heart that may have been shut; and let us reach out with love, forgiveness, and kindness to all those who are riding with us on the bus of life.

12 Days of Christmas

The Church primarily celebrates Christmas for twelve days from Christmas Day until the Solemnity of the Epiphany, which commemorates the manifestation of Christ as the Savior of the whole world (cf. Mt. 2:1-12). The Church has also traditionally celebrated Christmas for 40 days, culminating on the Feast of the Presentation on Feb. 2. During this time, the birth of Christ is celebrated as one continuous festival. It is just as important to celebrate during the Christmas season as it is to prepare for Christ during Advent.


