

# **TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE**

Sunday, January 7<sup>th</sup> Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage"... They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage.

# Reflection

"The magi were truly wise, for not only did they set out at once for Judea once they saw the star at its rising, they also changed their plan to return to Herod after finding the child. They had an epiphany, as it were, after encountering the Messiah, after finding him in a place they could not have anticipated when they'd left their homes. We would do well to be open to epiphanies of our own after an unexpected encounter with the Lord."



# Blessing Of Homes On The Epiphany Of The Lord

"The traditional method for blessing homes this day [uses] incense, chalk (an incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made), and "Jordan water." The chalk is used to mark 20 + C + M + B + 24 over doorways. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar—and also stand for the Latin motto *Christus, mansionem benedicat* ('May Christ bless the house')."

# **EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION**

The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter.

Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith that are celebrated each year.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

# On the fourteenth day of February

will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the thirty-first day of March

you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twelfth day of May

will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the nineteenth day of May,

the feast of Pentecost.

On the **second** day of **June**,

the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the first day of December,

the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.





## **EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR KIDS**

Based on the Ten Commandments.

This week we look at the first five Commandments.

#### First Commandment

"You shall have no other gods before me."

Make God the most important thing in your life. Have I put God first, or have I sometimes made other things in my life more important than God? Do I remember to talk to God? Do I choose what God wants for me over what I want for myself?

### **Second Commandment**

"You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God."

**Use God's name the right way.** Have I used God's name with care? Have I used God's name in the wrong way (for example, saying "God" when I wasn't really talking to Him or talking about Him)?

#### **Third Commandment**

"Observe the Sabbath day and keep it holy."

**Make Sunday a day to worship God.** Have I tried my best to worship God at Mass by singing, praying, and listening? Have I misbehaved during Mass?

### **Fourth Commandment**

"Honor your father and your mother."


**Love your parents and follow their rules.** Have I obeyed my parents—even when they are not looking? Have I talked back to them?

#### Fifth Commandment

"You shall not murder."

Be kind to the people and animals God made. Have I been kind to others? Have I solved disagreements in a peaceful way? Have I fought with anyone? Have I taken good care of my pets?


