


TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE

Sunday, April 28, 2024 John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. . .If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

"We are connected to each other, like the branches of a vine. All of us are connected to Jesus as the vine itself. As the vine, Jesus gives us support and sustenance, enabling us to bear fruit. We do this when we put our faith into practice."

DAILY READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Monday Acts of the Apostles 14:5-18; John 14:21-26

<u>Saint Catherine of Siena, Virgin and Doctor of the Church (Memorial)</u> – At the age of six, Catherine experienced a vision and dedicated herself to God. She joined the Dominican Third Order. Around age twenty-one, she felt called to become more active in the world, caring for the poor and tending the sick. She is especially remembered for her spiritual reflections, *The Dialogue*.

Tuesday Acts of the Apostles 14:19-28; John 14:27-31a

Wednesday Acts of the Apostles 15:1-6; John 15:1-8

Thursday Acts of the Apostles 15:7-21; John 15:9-11

<u>Saint Athanasius</u>, <u>Bishop and Doctor of the Church (Memorial)</u> –

Athanasius became one of the most dedicated opponents of the heresy of Arianism. Much of his life was a testimony to the divinity of Jesus Christ.

Friday 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; John 14:6-14

<u>Saints Philip and James. Apostles (Feast)</u> – Philip and James were apostles of Jesus. The choice of Philip as a disciple is recorded in Matthew, Mark, and Luke. John's gospel records several conversations between Jesus and Philip. James, the son of Alphaeus, is called "James the Less" (to differentiate from the other St. James, son of Zebedee). He is mentioned in Mark and in Acts.

after the 8:30 AM Mass followed by Benediction at 3 PM

What is Eucharistic Adoration? A priest or deacon removes the sacred host from the tabernacle and places it in the monstrance on the altar for adoration by the faithful. Eucharistic Adoration is adoring, or honoring, the Eucharistic Presence of Christ.

"The reality that, in the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ without ceasing to appear as bread and wine to our five senses is one of the central mysteries of the Catholic faith. This faith is a doorway through which we, like the saints and mystics before us, may enter into a deeper perception of the mercy and love manifested in and through Christ's sacramental presence in our midst. Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharistic celebration. We rejoice in the growing numbers of the faithful who pray in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, a testament of faith in the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist."

First Eucharist

Sacraments Celebrate Christ's Life...

Tradition tells us that all of the sacraments were instituted by Christ and they each have a real foundation in the life and ministry of Jesus. Each relates to stories and teachings of Jesus.

For example, Eucharist reminds us of the Last Supper. Those familiar with the Gospels are also reminded of other meals to which Jesus invited even those who were rejected by others.

"The sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. The visible rites by which the sacraments are celebrated signify and make present the graces proper to each sacrament. They bear fruit in those who receive them with the required dispositions" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #1131).

All sacraments are necessarily related to baptism, the first sacrament we celebrate. First Communion is an extension of that day as children are welcomed to the family meal—the Eucharist. Please complete the workbook and banner kit you received at the First Eucharist Parent Meeting.

There will be two First Communion Masses. At least one parent and their child are asked to attend the rehearsal for the First Communion Mass they have chosen.
