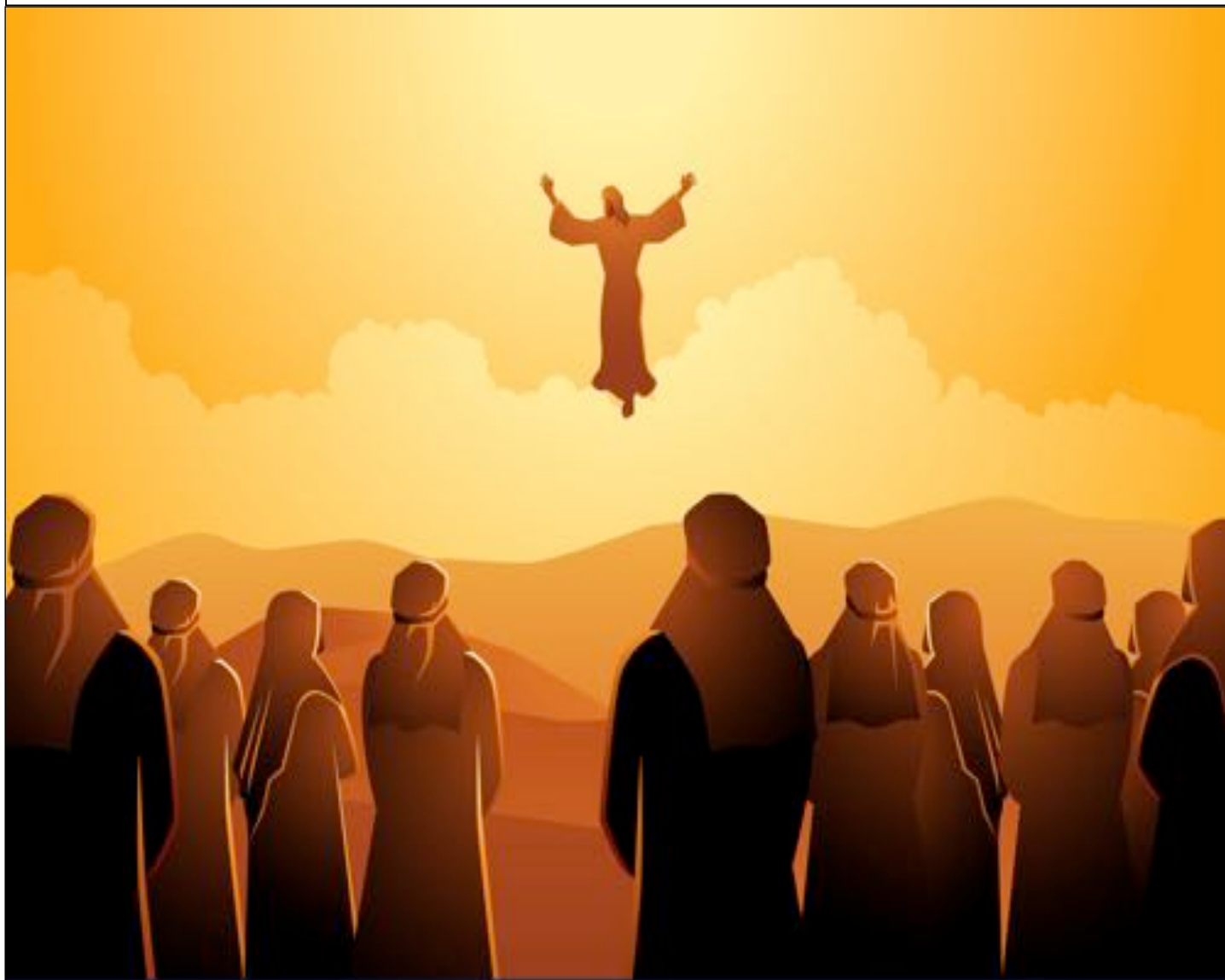

**TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE**

Sunday, May 12, 2024

Mark 16:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned." . . . So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God. But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.

**Reflection**

"When Jesus ascended to be with the Father, he ascended to a state beyond life and death, beyond sickness and suffering. This is now our hope. We look forward to when we are raised to a place beyond life and death, beyond sickness and suffering, beyond sin and imperfection, beyond hate and evil. Now it is our mission to bring that hope to others, to proclaim the Good News."

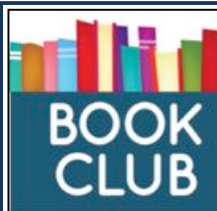

## "Passing on the Faith"

I had the great blessing of growing up in a family in which faith was lived in a simple, practical way. However, it was my paternal grandmother, in particular, who influenced my journey of faith. She was a woman who explained to us, who talked to us about Jesus, who taught us the Catechism. I always remember that on the evening of Good Friday, she would take us to the candlelight procession, and at the end of this procession, 'the dead Christ' would arrive, and our grandmother would make us—the children—kneel down, and she would say to us, 'Look, he is dead, but tomorrow he will rise.' This was how I received my first Christian proclamation, from this very woman, from my grandmother!

And this makes me think of the love of so many mothers and grandmothers in the transmission of faith. They are the ones who pass on the faith. This used to happen in the early Church too, for St. Paul said to Timothy, 'I am reminded of the faith of your mother and of your grandmother' (cf. 2 Timothy 1:5). All the mothers and all the grandmothers who are here should think about this: passing on the faith! Because God sets beside us people who help us on our journey of faith. We do not find our faith in the abstract, no! It is always a person preaching who tells us who Jesus is, who communicates faith to us and gives us the first proclamation. And this is how I received my first experience of faith."

## St. Simon Stock Carmelite Feast Day May 16

Our Lady gave St. Simon a scapular for the Carmelites with the following promise: Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order. This shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire...It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace.



"Mary is often portrayed in art as 'Our Lady of Mount Carmel', dressed in a brown habit with white cloak and looking indeed very 'Carmelite'. She holds the child Jesus in one arm, and from the other drapes a small piece of brown cloth, the scapular. This small scapular is derived from the scapular cloth worn by Carmelite religious originally to protect their habit while they were at work. . .It serves as a constant reminder that our spiritual journey is lived out in the everyday, working-world events of our daily life. The brown scapular today is a symbol of belonging, to one degree or another, to the Carmelite family."

# Angie Bracconeri

OLMC Parishioner for 74 Years!

Angela "Angie" DeAngelis Bracconeri was born with a natural inclination to serve others. Celebrating her remarkable 104th birthday on May 1st, she traces her roots back to Manhattan's vibrant Harlem district of the 1920s. As the youngest of four children to immigrant parents from Italy, Thomas and Maria, Angie quickly assumed responsibilities beyond her years, assisting her mother with household chores and acting as a translator for her family and neighbors, bridging the gap between English and Italian.

Known for her boundless generosity, Angie became a beloved figure in her community, always ready to lend a helping hand with shopping, babysitting, or running errands without hesitation. Her compassionate nature endeared her to neighbors, friends, and family alike, earning her a reputation as someone who selflessly gave of herself whenever needed.

Event planning and organization became Angie's forte from a young age. When her high school prom faced cancellation due to a lack of coordination, Angie stepped up without hesitation, taking charge of the event. The result was a magical evening at Manhattan's renowned Cotton Club, featuring performances by Cab Calloway and Lena Horne. Angie would go on to marry her prom date, Leo Bracconeri.

Early in their marriage they lived in the Bronx, New York where three of their children were born. Besides raising her young children she also attended to the caring of her ailing mother.

Settling in Tenaflly in 1950, Angie and Leo raised five children in their home on Engle Street, where all were welcomed with open arms. Angie's commitment to serving others extended beyond her family, becoming deeply involved in Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, which she considers her second home. She was an avid fund raiser, was a member of Our Lady of Mount Carmel's Mother's Guild, she started the Children's Liturgy of the Word program, was a CCD teacher, a lector, and served on the "International Night" fundraising committee for several years and her decorations are still talked about today. Her most important role was serving as a Eucharistic Minister bringing comfort and solace to the community's elderly and infirm.

Outside of her church duties, Angie continued to serve in various capacities, including on the Mayor's Committee for Seniors, a Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts leader, and as a volunteer at the Tenaflly Senior Center. Her culinary skills were put to good use, cooking for friends and neighbors, especially during the holidays. She lived in Weston, Vermont for a few years and fed 20 Benedictine Monks from the Weston Priory, each week. She also orchestrated monthly birthday celebrations for residents at the Tenaflly House.

**Diaper Need**

***Clean diapers are a basic need of every baby.***

A clean diaper means a happy, healthy baby.

No parent should have to make the impossible choice between food and diapers for their child.

***5.2 million babies live in poor or low income families.***

Diapers are not covered by SNAP, WIC or Federal or State programs. Babies may require up to 12 diapers per day, or up to \$70 to \$80 per child per month.

Diaper Need affects 1 in 2 families who cannot afford enough diapers to keep their infant child clean, dry and healthy. ***These babies are more vulnerable to painful rashes and urinary track infections and more trips to the doctors.***

***Without diapers babies cannot participate in Early Childhood Education.*** Without Early Childhood Education, parents cannot go to work. Students that participate in Early Childhood Education are 2.5 times more likely to go to higher education.

Families with diaper shortages reported ***more difficulty with stress management, depression and coping with trauma which can negatively affect a child's health and development.***

*Please donate diapers or send a contribution so the Office of Concern can continue to provide a better life for babies in need of diapers.*
