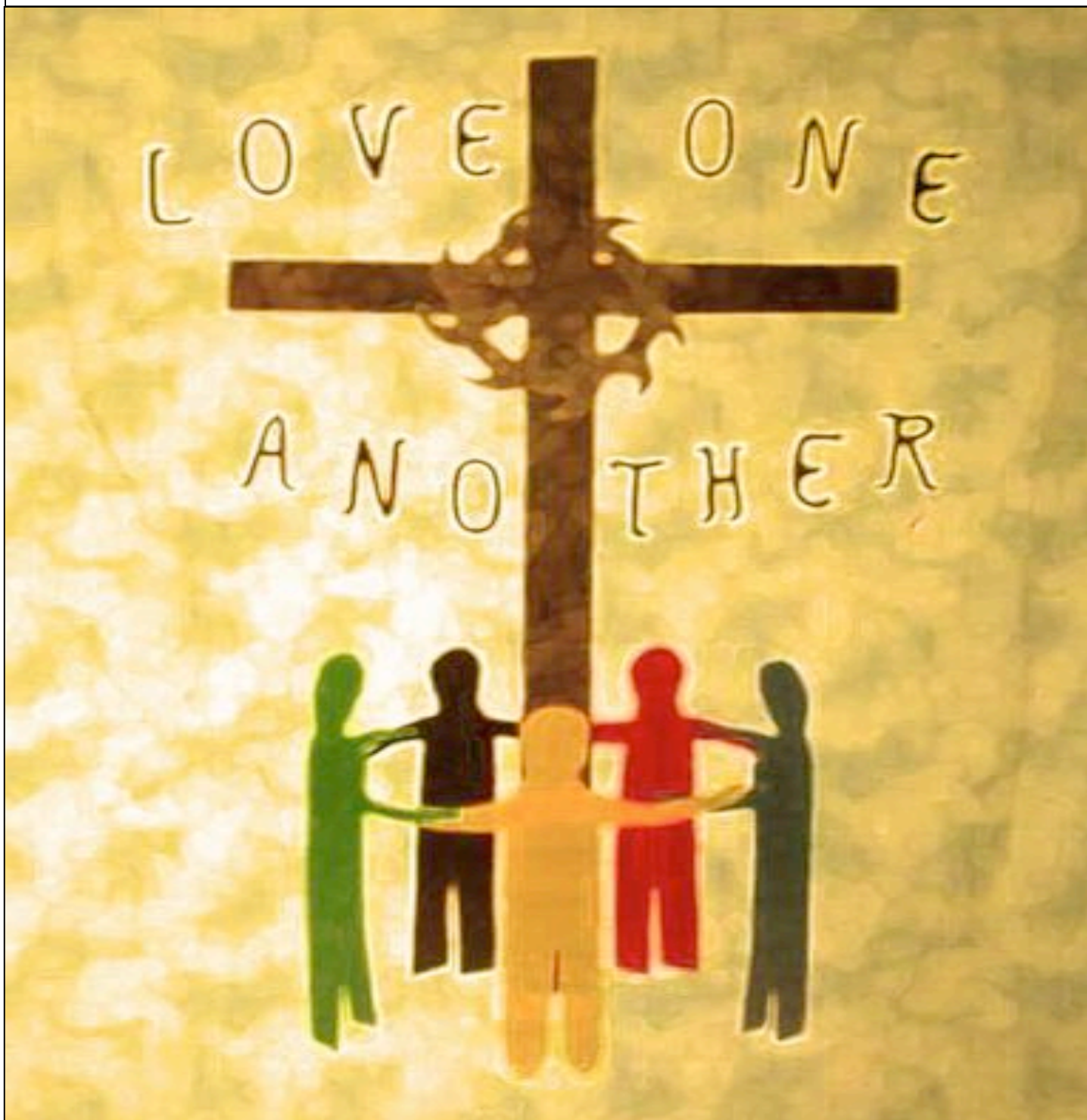

TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE

Sunday, May 5, 2024

John 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love...This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends...This I command you: love one another."

Reflection

"Jesus tells us, the ultimate show of love is 'to lay down one's life for one's friends'. Love is over-the-moon wonderful until you start talking about its cost. Love can cause you to put someone else's life before your own. Love can leave you vulnerable. Love can lead to heartbreak and grief. But this is what Jesus himself did, and what he calls us to do. Self-sacrificing love is the countercultural and, to many, absurd idea of putting others before yourself, for, as John wrote in his letter, God is love, and this, from the start of creation, is what God has done."

Thursday, May 9th will not be a holy day of obligation, and there will only be the regularly scheduled 8:30 AM Mass that day.

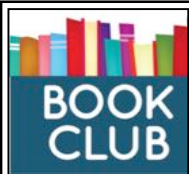
MEN’S CORNERSTONE

“The Problem of Evil”

*“Blessed are they who mourn
for they shall be comforted.” – Jesus*

*

I struggle with the ‘Problem of Evil’. That is the problem posed by the presence of the evil we witness in our world, and the question: “If God is really all powerful and all loving, and if God truly knows and loves each one of us by name, why does God allow evil and terrible things to happen?”

I mourned as I followed news of the unfolding Russian invasion of Ukraine, and learned about the violence inflicted on women, children and even babies; the vicious bombings of hospitals, residential neighborhoods and schools, and the summary executions of Ukrainian soldiers and civilians. I mourned for the umpteenth time as I watched the breaking news and heard the cries of parents, friends, and first responders after the shootings in Buffalo, Uvalde, and Tulsa—the list goes on and on. And, yet Jesus tells us, “Blessed are they who mourn”—*we who mourn*—for we shall be comforted.

These acts of human evil are not evidence that God does not exist, or that God fails to love us; nor are they proof that God is powerless to rescue us. Life is a mystery, like a tapestry that we cannot see fully while we are in its midst. But, God is with us in that mystery; God walks with us through the presence of evil holding us by the hand as we mourn, leading us to Resurrection.

“Blessed are they who mourn”—*we who mourn*—for we shall be comforted. Someday, someplace, somehow, it will all make sense.

But in the meantime, while we are here and continue to follow the news and witness the existence of evil in our world, the Cross, the symbol of our faith, is God’s answer to the problem of evil. In the center of the Cross, in the center of the pain and the suffering, we find God in human form. The message of the Cross is hope. It tells us that we are not alone, that God is with us in the center of the pain and the suffering; and someday it will all make sense, there will be a happy ending, a Resurrection.

The Cross is a sign that God is with us in our suffering and that death is not the end. When we read the Passion and hear Jesus’ cry, “My God, why have you forsaken me?” we know that he understands what we are going through; that he is our brother in the face of horrible evil. Our brother, our savior who takes us—the temporary prisoners of evil—through the sufferings of life, who leads us to the joy of Resurrection, to a place where everything will make sense and we will see God.

The Cross is our comfort and God’s answer to the problem of evil. Blessed are we who mourn, for we will be comforted.



“The death and resurrection of Jesus are the heart of our hope. It is the resurrection itself that opens us to greater hope, for it opens our lives and the life of the world to the eternal future of God, to full happiness, to the certainty that evil, sin, and death may be overcome.”

Tradition tells us that all of the sacraments were instituted by Christ and they each have a real foundation in the life and ministry of Jesus. Each relates to stories and teachings of Jesus.

For example, Eucharist reminds us of the Last Supper. Those familiar with the Gospels are also reminded of other meals to which Jesus invited even those who were rejected by others.

“The sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. The visible rites by which the sacraments are celebrated signify and make present the graces proper to each sacrament. They bear fruit in those who receive them with the required dispositions” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1131*).

Diaper Need

Clean diapers are a basic need of every baby.

A clean diaper means a happy, healthy baby.

No parent should have to make the impossible choice between food and diapers for their child.

5.2 million babies live in poor or low income families.

Diapers are not covered by SNAP, WIC or Federal or State programs. Babies may require up to 12 diapers per day, or up to \$70 to \$80 per child per month.

Diaper Need affects 1 in 2 families who cannot afford enough diapers to keep their infant child clean, dry and healthy. **These babies are more vulnerable to painful rashes and urinary track infections and more trips to the doctors.**

Without diapers babies cannot participate in Early Childhood Education. Without Early Childhood Education, parents cannot go to work. Students that participate in Early Childhood Education are 2.5 times more likely to go to higher education.

Families with diaper shortages reported **more difficulty with stress management, depression and coping with trauma which can negatively affect a child's health and development.**

Please donate diapers or send a contribution so the Office of Concern can continue to provide a better life for babies in need of diapers.
